English	Read one of the books from the recommended reading list. Write a book review, explaining what parts of the book you enjoyed the most and why.	Write a story set in an African environment.	Write an acrostic or shape poem linked to an African theme.
Maths/Science/Computing	Make a PowerPoint or mini-documentary about an African animal.	Collect data on the populations of different African countries and present the data in a chart of your choice (e.g. bar graph/pie chart).	Research a species of animal that lives in Africa and present the information as a poster or booklet.
Art/ D.T	Research, design and create an African mask or hand puppet.	Construct an African drum using recycled materials of your choice.	Create a picture of an African landscape in the medium of your choice.
History/ Geography	Research an African country of your choice. Create a travel brochure aimed at persuading holidaymakers to visit your destination. You might want to consider the weather, climate, landscape and activities in that country.	Write a fact file about Nelson Mandela containing key facts and pictures.	Find out about popular tourist destinations and present the information as a poster or a booklet.
Music/ Drama/ P.E.	Research and write about a famous African sportsman or sportswoman. This can include famous African teams e.g. cricket and football.	Research an African game or sport. Create a 'rule book' for the game.	Learn a traditional African song or dance and film your performance to share in class.
